

**ANNOUNCING: FREE 4-H SEWING CLASSES (BEGINNER SKILL LEVEL)**

Through its Cooperative Extension Program, Kentucky 4-H actively trains volunteers to teach sewing classes. Once the two year training period is complete, these volunteers are certified as Master Clothing Volunteers (MCVs) and required to perform 50 hours of sewing related community service each year. There are several MCVs living in Jefferson County and one of them, Claudia Smith, lives right here in Shively. Using her 30+ years of sewing experience and her MCV training, she will be conducting beginner level sewing lessons starting in September 2016. Here are the sewing class details:

 Who: Ages 12 and older (adults are welcome).  
 When: Beginning September 24, 2016  
 Time: 10:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. on Saturdays

Space is limited so students will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis. A waiting list will be maintained if there is sufficient interest. Students must purchase their own fabrics, patterns, and supplies, including a sewing machine. Special arrangements may be possible for a limited number of those who do not have a sewing machine. Intermediate and advanced seamstresses are invited to join the classes to help give more individual attention to the beginning sewists. (Yep, that's a word now. It distinguishes the wonderful craft of sewing from the word used to describe a waste disposal system in the written word – sewer.)

**TAX OFFICE NEWS**

In June the Shively City Council voted on the Mayor's recommendation to retain the current property tax rate of .339 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation. Shively is pleased to be able to run the city efficiently without change in services. You should have received your 2016 Shively property tax notice in the mail. We send tax bills to all owners of property. If you escrow funds to pay your taxes with your mortgage lender, it is your responsibility to forward your tax bill to your lending company. The city does send a copy of the original bill to the mortgage company only if the mortgage company calls our office to make the request. Property tax bills are due to be paid on or before Friday, September 30th. Just as a reminder city hall is open M-F, 8-4:30 pm, (502) 449-5000.

**DISABILITY EXEMPTION** What is it: **The Disability Exemption** for 2015-2016 is \$36,900. Call PVA 574-6380 to see if you qualify or to ask questions.

Kentucky's Constitution allows property owners who are 100% disabled to receive the Disability Exemption. If you are approved to receive the Disability Exemption, the exemption amount is subtracted from your property's assessed value, reducing your property tax liability. The exemption amount may be adjusted every two years to reflect a change in the cost of living index used by the United States Department of Labor.

Only one exemption (Homestead or Disability) is allowed per household. You can receive the Disability Exemption on residential or commercial property as long as you own and occupy the property. Disability Exemption recipients may be required to apply annually. If you have an exemption and sell your property, please contact the PVA Homestead Department at (502) 574-6380 option 3.

**HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION** What is it? **The Homestead Exemption** for 2015-2016 is \$36,900. Call PVA 574-6380 to see if you qualify or ask questions.

Kentucky's Constitution allows property owners who are 65 or older to receive the Homestead Exemption on their primary residence. If you are eligible to receive the Homestead Exemption, the exemption amount is subtracted from your property's assessed value, reducing your property tax liability.

Only one exemption (Homestead or Disability) is allowed per household. Those who currently receive the exemption need not reapply. You can receive the Homestead Exemption on residential or commercial property as long as you own and occupy the property. If you have an exemption and sell your property, please contact the PVA Homestead Department at (502) 574-6380 option 3.

**KRS 132.810(2) (h)** provides, "When title to property which is exempted, either in whole or in part, under the homestead exemption is transferred, the owner, administrator, executor, trustee, guardian, conservator, curator or agent shall report such transfer to The Property Valuation Administrator."

**ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA LIST:**

To qualify for the Homestead Exemption a property owner must:

- Be 65 years or older
- Own and Occupy the property as your primary residence prior to January 1

**National Fire Prevention Week** will be October 9-15, 2016. This year's campaign is centered on smoke alarms in the home. The slogan is: **DON'T WAIT...CHECK THE DATE!! REPLACE FIRE AND SMOKE ALARMS EVERY 10 YEARS** Listed below are some startling facts about home fires and smoke alarms:

- HOME FIRES**
- Half of home fire deaths result from fires reported between 11p.m. and 7a.m. when most people are asleep. Only one in five home fires was reported during these hours.
  - One quarter of home fire deaths were caused by fires that started in the bedroom. Another quarter resulted from fires in the living room, family room or den.
  - Three out of five home fire deaths happen from fires in homes with no smoke alarms or no working smoke alarms.
  - In 2014, U.S. fire departments responded to an estimated 367,500 home structure fires. These fires caused 2,745 deaths, 11,875 civilian injuries, and \$6.8 billion in direct damage.
  - On average, seven people die in U.S. home fires per day.
  - Cooking equipment is the leading cause of home fire injuries, followed by heating equipment.
  - Smoking materials are the leading cause of home fire deaths.
  - During 2009-2013, roughly one in every 335 households had a reported home fire per year.

- SMOKE ALARMS**
- Three out of five home fire deaths in 2009-2013 were caused by fires in homes with no smoke alarms or working smoke alarms.
  - Working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in reported home fires in HALF.
  - When smoke alarms fail to operate, it is usually because batteries are missing, disconnected, or dead.

As you can see by these statistics, having a working smoke alarm in your home is a very inexpensive way to insure that you and your loved ones have the best possible odds of surviving a fire if it occurs in your house. So, go check the date of manufacture on the smoke alarm(s) in your home. It is usually located on the back of the alarm. If it is over ten years old, replace it with a new one! Also, remember to test the operation of your smoke alarms at least twice a year. To help you remember, it is a good idea to check them in the spring and in the fall when we reset our clocks.

**PROPERTY TAX BILLS 2016**

We enjoy tax season because it brings many friendly faces into City Hall. The tax payment deadline is September 30th. There is a 10% penalty that will apply on Oct 1st, plus 12% per annum. You can pay in person at Shively City Hall, Monday – Friday, 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m., or we can accept payment with a credit card by phone, 449-5000. If you mail your payment by mail we do accept postmark dates. All delinquent taxes will be subject to a lien, adding an additional \$176.00 to the amount of your taxes.
