A Note From The Mayor

Greetings!
Again we are, as a city, very financially sound and I am so proud of this as Mayor. This is certainly nothing I can do on my own...I have a lot of help.
I looked at last year's address and I am happy to share that we achieved some of the goals I had proposed, such as
We have added lighting throughout the city and still have more to install. Stimulus checks.....they were mailed out before the end of 2015. Thank you to the Council members that help get that achieved.
Annual "Shred it" day...this has been so well received and we will plan it at least once a year.
We will be paving even more roads again this year.
Sidewalks.....we have been fortunate enough to be awarded a grant to install sidewalks on some of our streets that have needed them for a long time.
We continue to plant trees in the park and different areas of the City.
We are partnering with Metro Louisville to create a Towne Center in Shively. It will make the City more attractive and hopefully help with traffic flow.
We are also working with Metro Louisville on the Dixie Highway Corridor Project. This project has been the in the works for a long time and with federal money now having been awarded towards it we are going to see some results soon.
We are working with the other 82 small suburban cities to help Metro Louisville become a Google City. If this happens we will all reap the rewards of the internet becoming 10 times faster than now.

Your City Hall web-page has been updated and our forms can be accessed and downloaded for your use.
Your Fire Department made 940 runs in 2015. That is up 80 runs. 445 of them were medical related, 164 were fire related and 331 were rescue/HazMat and other hazardous responses.
People kept missing the large item junk pick up because they didn't call in advance. Now you don't need to call to have it picked up and our hope is that this will better accommodate you.
This past January the Police Department had a very scary incident, which I am sure most of you saw or heard about, when one of our police officers was shot. The response from our community and surrounding communities was nothing short of incredible. So many residents, businesses, other law enforcement agencies came to our aide without asking what we needed. People brought food, others offered prayers and we actually had residents returned their stimulus checks to be donated to help the officer's family. I can't thank these folks enough, regardless of how small you may think your gift was, believe me it was very much appreciated. It makes you believe in the goodness of people just when you begin to have doubts. So I try to remember not to lose hope when the sun goes down because then the stars come out! And we had a lot of "stars" during this difficult time.

Information on Trash, Recycling and Yard Waste Collection

Complete Sanitation Calendar and Rules can be found at www.cityofshively.gov or call 449-5010.

Additional carts can be purchased from City Hall for \$75.00. Keeping our community clean and attractive is everyone's responsibility, which is why the City of Shively offers convenient curbside collection services. Use this guide to take full advantage of the services.

The Basics for Trash Collection

- Trash must be bagged and placed inside of the blue City of Shively carts.
- Trash in bags/cardboard boxes outside the cart will not be picked up.
- Do not overfill the blue cart or pack trash in too tightly.
- Do not fill with items making the cart too heavy to be emptied.

Only the blue City of Shively carts will be picked up during curbside collection. No store bought cans/carts.

- Always keep your cart lid closed.

The Basics about Yard Waste Disposal

- The curbside yard waste collection program runs from March thru December 27, 2016.
- Yard waste is grass clippings, weeds, leaves and trimmings from bushes.
- Place yard waste in paper landscape bags or in your own 20-32 gallon containers.
- Yard waste containers should never be over 50 pounds. If too heavy it will not be picked up.
- Do not use plastic bags or cardboard boxes.

The Basics on Collection Day

- Place carts at the curb in front of your home, three feet apart, after 5pm the night before or by 6am on your collection day.
 - The handle of your cart should face the house.
 - Once your trash has been collected, remove your cart from the curb at the end of your trash day.
- Limits on the Number of Yard Waste Bags and Containers
- Households are limited to a combined 8 yard waste paper bags, yard waste containers, or bundles of brush per week.
 - Branches and trimmings from shrubs must be cut into a manageable size (no longer than 4 feet) and bundled into a manageable weight.
 - Limbs shall not extend more than one foot from the top of can.

The Basics about Large/Bulk Items

- Households are limited to 3 bulk items on large item pick up day.
- Each trash route has a specific day monthly for large item pick up.
- DESKS, CHAIRS, COUCHES, LOVESEATS, APPLIANCES, ETC., ARE CONSIDERED "LARGE ITEMS."

- NO CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS, TIRES, OR HAZARDOUS MATERIALS.
- You do not have to call in advance anymore to get on a list.

The Basics of Household Hazardous Waste Disposal

- Household Hazardous Materials drop-off collection, or HAZ BIN, is available to all residents of Shively. It provides a safe and convenient way to dispose of unwanted household hazardous materials which are not accepted by curbside garbage collection or recycling.

Ways to Take Pride in Caring for Houses, Lawns and Gardens in Shively

The City encourages property owners to take pride in the look of their homes and yards. Well tended lawns and gardens and well maintained houses add to the appeal of Shively neighborhoods. They also strengthen property values, which benefits people economically, in addition to providing a nice quality of life. Rules for maintaining property in Shively can be reviewed at www.shivelyky.gov. To help everyone meet Shively's basic standards, here is a summary of some of the most important tasks.

Grass and landscaping

- Keep grass and weeds cut to six inches or less. This includes along all fence and property lines.
- Trim trees, bushes and landscaping so that they are not in the way of people walking on the sidewalk/vehicles driving in the street.
- Do not park or drive on grass.

No litter allowed

- Pick up litter on your property, even if someone else has thrown it there. Pitch in to keep our City beautiful by picking up litter in your neighborhood.

Keep your property free of “junk”

- Don't store “junk,” like broken cars, motors, appliances, used wood, or discarded furniture on your lawn or porch.
- Don't store recreational vehicles, trailers, and boats on your grass or any soft surface of the yard.

Report Graffiti

- The City addresses unsightly graffiti promptly. Call 449-5000 to report.
