It is with great pleasure to report that the City of Shively turned 80 years old in 2018 and is fiscally sound. Moving forward, we will continue to work on attracting new business and improve infrastructure within the city, as well as healthy and safe neighborhoods.

As we enter a new year, there are new opportunities to grow and enhance our community collectively. I would like to encourage all residents to make a difference by becoming involved in our diverse Shively community. City Hall is busy with collecting taxes and working with various programs. They are in the midst of upgrading technology and security measures for our main building. Our fire department has been extremely busy as well. In 2018 they made 2,399 runs.

In 2018 our Code Enforcement board were able to address 2,160 complaints. It is because of their team efforts and hard work, that the city collected over 100,000 in fines. Thank you all who maintain their property.

The public works department anticipates that the Sidewalk project will be completed by the end of 2019. This will include the streets of Gars Lane, Mary Catherine and Farnsley Road. The works department has also implemented an automated system to collect recycling, and purchased 95 gallon totes for residents that choose to participate in recycling.

The police department will be seeking to add a traffic car that will specifically be assigned to running radar in the city to combat speeding complaints in various areas. This unit vehicle will also help investigate serious motor vehicle accidents where injuries could be fatal.

Please continue to monitor our electronic sign in front of City Hall and read your newsletters. This will allow you the opportunity to stay informed of changes to our city and information about various programs and events. To all the departments, thank you for work you do and the service you give to Shively.

To the residents, always remember that your comments and input help us to make important decisions about the city. Remember that "Shively is a small city, with big ideas and this is your home, your community and your city."

PURPLE HEART CITY RESOLUTION AND PROCLAMATION**

WHEREAS, the people of the City of Shively, Kentucky have great admiration and the utmost gratitude for all of the men and women who have selflessly served their country and the City of Shively in the armed forces, and

WHEREAS, veterans have paid the high price for freedom by leaving their families and communities and placing themselves in harm’s way for the good of all, and

WHEREAS, the contributions and sacrifices of the men and women from the City of Shively who served in the armed forces have been vital in maintaining the freedoms and way of life enjoyed by our citizens, and

WHEREAS, many men and women in uniform have given their lives while serving in the armed forces, and

WHEREAS, many citizens of our community may have earned the Purple Heart Medal, as a result of being wounded while engaged in combat with an enemy force, construed as a singularly meritorious act of essential services, and

WHEREAS, March 24, 2012 has officially been designated as the day in which to remember and recognize veterans who are recipients of the Purple Heart Medal, now therefore:

BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Shively Mayor and Council hereby proclaim the City of Shively, Kentucky as a Purple Heart City, to honor the service and sacrifice of our nation's men and women in uniform wounded or killed by the enemy while serving to protect the freedom enjoyed by all Americans.
