PARKING ON UNPAVED RESIDENTIAL AREAS

72.42 PARKING PROHIBITION.

It shall be unlawful and a violation of this subchapter for any person, corporation, firm or other entity to park or leave standing any automobile, truck, boat, motor home, trailer or other vehicle on the unpaved portion of a residential lot or yard. Gravel driveways and parking pads existing at the time of passage of this ordinance are herewith excepted from the prohibition herein. (Ord. 1-2009, passed 6-8-09)

In 2018 our Code Enforcement board were able to address 2,160 complaints. It is because of their team efforts and hard work, that the city collected over 100, 000 in fines. Thank you to all who maintain their property.

The public works department anticipates that the Sidewalk project will be completed by the end of 2019. This will include the streets of Garrs Lane, Mary Catherine and Farnsley Road. The works department has also implemented an automated system to collect recycling, and purchased 95 gallon totes for residents that choose to participate in recycling.

The police department will be seeking to add a traffic car that will specifically be assigned to running radar in the city to combat speeding complaints in various areas. This unit vehicle will also help investigate serious motor vehicle accidents where injuries could be fatal.

Please continue to monitor our electronic sign in front of City Hall and read your newsletters. This will allow you the opportunity to stay informed of changes to our city and information about various programs and events. To all the departments, thank you for work you do and the service you give to Shively.


To the residents, always remember that your comments and input help us to make important decisions about the city. Remember that “Shively is a small city, with big ideas and this is your home, your community and your city.”



Residential and Commercial Alarm Systems

In February 2017, the Shively Police Department began registering home and commercial alarm systems within the city. In addition, we began leaving notifications of our response to an address when the alarm was determined to be false/unwarranted.

Reminder, the Shively Police Department, in conjunction with the Shively Code Enforcement Board will be issuing City Code Citations to addresses with three or more false/unwarranted alarms within a calendar year. It is the duty and responsibility of the property owner or resident/tenant to ensure that alarms are properly functioning and measures are in place to mitigate false/unwarranted alarms.

All residential and commercial properties within the City of Shively are required to register their alarm system with the Police Department. Alarm registration forms can be picked up at the Shively Police Station anytime or download from the forms section of the Shively Police Webpage, www.shivelyky.gov. There is no fee for registering alarms.
