



Code Enforcement Corner

PARKING ON UNPAVED RESIDENTIAL AREAS

72.42 PARKING PROHIBITION.

It shall be unlawful and a violation of this subchapter for any person, corporation, firm or other entity to park or leave standing any automobile, truck, boat, motor home, trailer or other vehicle on the unpaved portion of a residential lot or yard. Gravel driveways and parking pads existing at the time of passage of this ordinance are herewith excepted from the prohibition herein. (Ord. 1-2009, passed 6-8-09)



There are approximately 100 boards and commissions with many areas of interest, including business and economic development, land planning, parks and recreation, public health and public safety.

The New Dixie Highway Project is a \$35 million project that represents the largest investment in transportation infrastructure in Louisville since the Ohio River Bridges Project. We are slightly more than halfway through the two-year active construction phase. The project will be substantially complete in Dec. 2019, but some final parts of the project – such as the final surfacing and landscaping – can not be completed in winter and will have to wait until next Spring and Summer.

Beginning in the next few months, you will see medians being built on The New Dixie Highway Project. Medians will be used to reduce the number of mid-block left turns. While it may seem inconvenient to have a median blocking a turn, there are two key ways that medians are helpful.

- 1) Safety. Left turns are ten times more dangerous than right turns according to some statistics.
- 2) Traffic flow. Cutting across lanes for mid-block left turns cause slowdowns and backups.

In fact, UPS drivers rarely turn left, because routes involving right turns are faster, more efficient and safer.

PVA ONLINE CONFERENCE AND APPEALS

THE 2019 PVA ONLINE CONFERENCES WILL BEGIN AT 12:00PM EDT ON APRIL 26, 2019, AND END ON MAY 20, 2019 AT 4:00PM EDT.

During this time, if you think your assessment does not represent the fair market value of your property, by law, you can request a review from the Jefferson County PVA by participating in the online conference process.

When the assessment of your property increases or decreases from the prior year, the PVA will send you a reassessment notice in mid April. However, you do not have to receive a reassessment notice in order to contest your property assessment. As a property owner, you have the right to contest your assessment each year. By law, certain steps must be followed in the process.

Trash, recycling, large item, & yardwaste guidelines

SOLID WASTE (BLUE TOTE) – WEEKLY

- Only the city provided 95 or 65 gallon blue trash tote will be emptied
- Items not in the trash tote will not be picked up
- Additional trash totes can be purchased for \$75 through city hall

RECYCLING (GREEN TOTE) - EVERY MONDAY

- Newspapers & cardboard: no magazines or phonebooks. Do not put newspapers in a bag or tie with string. Cardboard must be broken down
- Glass bottles & jars: rinse all glass. Labels do not need to be removed. Remove lids and throw away in trash tote
- Aluminum cans: rinse and flatten
- Plastic milk jugs and beverage bottles with recycle symbol on bottom: rinse and flatten. Throw lids in trash tote
- Tin cans: remove labels, rinse and flatten

LARGE ITEM COLLECTION – ONE FRIDAY PER MONTH (see schedule)

- Three item limit per pick up
- Do not set items out any sooner than the night before scheduled pick up
- Examples are : large bags, boxes, desks, chairs, couches, mattresses, tvs and appliances
- No construction materials, tires, or hazardous materials

YARDWASTE – EVERY TUESDAY IN MARCH THRU DECEMBER

- Leaves and limbs in paper bags (no plastic) or in non-city provided cans not to extend more than 1 foot from the top of can
- 50 Pound limit per can
- Branches must be bundled (4 feet or less)

Ways to Take Pride in Caring for Houses, Lawns and Gardens in Shively

The City encourages property owners to take pride in the look of their homes and yards. Well tended lawns and gardens and well maintained houses add to the appeal of Shively neighborhoods. They also strengthen property values, which benefits people economically, in addition to providing a nice quality of life. Rules for maintaining property in Shively can be reviewed at www.shivelyky.gov. To help everyone meet Shively's basic standards, here is a summary of some of the most important tasks.

Grass and landscaping

- Keep grass and weeds cut to EIGHT (8) inches or less. This includes along all fence and property lines.
- Trim trees, bushes and landscaping so that they are not in the way of people walking on the sidewalk/vehicles driving in the street.
- Do not park or drive on grass.

No litter allowed

- Pick up litter on your property, even if someone else has thrown it there. Pitch in to keep our City beautiful by picking up litter in your neighborhood.

Keep your property free of “junk”

- Don't store “junk,” like broken cars, motors, appliances, used wood, or discarded furniture on your lawn or porch.
- Don't store recreational vehicles, trailers, and boats on your grass or any soft surface of the yard.

Report Graffiti

- The City addresses unsightly graffiti promptly. Call 449-5000 to report.





Code Enforcement Corner

Code Enforcement works to identify violations of Shively's municipal ordinance within the Shively City Limits. We seek voluntary compliance from citizens to help maintain the quality of the community. Once a code violation is identified, the responsible party is notified to take corrective action.

Common Code Violations

- o Parking on the grass – All vehicles must be parked on a sealed surface, such as concrete or asphalt.
- o Trash – No trash or abandoned, discarded items are allowed on private property.
- o Public Nuisances - Neglect of property is considered as causing or allowing unsightly litter, tall weeds, and grass, yard waste, foul odor, junk covered by tarps, unsecured appliances.
- o Zoning Violation – Businesses operating illegally from residence
- o Property Maintenance Code issues – Tall grass or weeds that are over 8” in height.
- o Houses that do not have proper or missing house numbers.
- o Open Storage - Open storage is defined as the placement of an item that is not customarily used or stored outside, or that is made of a material that is not weather resistant in an unenclosed outdoor area. Open storage/tarps is prohibited in the front yard, on a front porch, or any other unenclosed area.
- o Newly constructed parking area cannot be constructed of gravel. All new/additional parking areas must be a sealed solid surface such as concrete or asphalt.
- o Exterior of homes/garages should be kept clean free from dirt and grime including environmental pollution.
