If the vacancy is not filled, the Governor shall promptly fill the vacancy. There is no set protocol to fill the vacancy, it is up to the council to come up with the solution as to how the vacancy will be filled.

Maria Johnson, motioned to select Wendell Vincent, he was the next highest in election results in the general election, to replace Delbert Vance’s vacancy on the council, second by Tiffany Burton-McBroom.

I am thinking about selling my home, the area is loud, I am very concerned about the situation, it feels like it is getting out of hand. I have to keep my windows closed and my sleep is disturbed because it is so loud.

Daneshia Hodges, 2115 Garrs Lane, I am with the program Lame is the New Cool. I have repositioned the program, the class begins September 28th, I am here to see if you would like to sponsor a class of ten children for three hundred dollars, \$300.00.
