David Carter, 1866 Farnsley Road, I want to know how it was determined which driveways, during sidewalk construction, would receive a new apron, and the amount of grant money spent on the project. It would look better if all driveways matched with new aprons. On Garrs Lane the sidewalk crossed 102 driveways, 26 received new aprons. On Mary Catherine the sidewalk crossed 60 driveways, 60 received new aprons. On Farnsley Road, 64 driveways, 34 received new aprons.

Dean Nevitt, 1859 Farnsley Road, I want to know why parts of the new sidewalk do not run parallel with Farnsley Road. I never saw anyone shooting the grade on the project. My driveway is now 9'6" wide it was 10'2". The concrete finishing work was top notch.

Jamie Bush, Carrie Dorton, 700 E. Muhammad Ali Blvd., Outreach Workers for St. John Center for Homeless Men. We would like to work with any homeless encampments that you have in Shively. City of Shively to adopt the 21-day process, like Louisville. We have been working in Shively, we have been working with the encampment on 7<sup>th</sup> Street for 4 months. We speak to the people everyday; we help them obtain ID's, locate housing, we want you to know you can call us.
