Hospitals and medical staff across the commonwealth stand ready to serve you.





NOTICE FROM WORKS DEPARTMENT

Oak's Day is a holiday for our department. With the Derby being postponed until September 5th, that change necessitates the changing of the Large Item pick-up for the Monday trash route to be switched from September 4th to September 11th.

Public Works Department NEWS

All trash routes are operating on a normal schedule during the COVID – 19 – VIRUS outbreak. As families spend more time at home more trash is expected to be produced. Remember that the tote lids should be shut when pushed to the curb. Garbage bags sitting on top or next to cans will not be picked up and may prevent picking up the tote. To avoid this issue additional trash cans can be purchased over the phone by calling city hall, 449-5000. The 95 gallon trash cans are \$75.00 each and will be delivered promptly, within 24 hours.

Yard waste and leaves should be placed loosely in a 32 Gallon barrel with handles or in special paper thirty (30) gallon capacity leaf bags. These bags can be purchased at local grocery or hardware stores. Yard waste is defined as: grass clippings, weeds, hedge clippings, as well as twigs and brush. Twigs and brush should not be longer than two (4) feet in length and one-half (1/2) inch in diameter. Bags and barrels shall not weigh more than 40 lbs. when full.

We will also pick up branches. Branches can be no wider than 3" in diameter and no longer than 4' and must be tied for pickup in manageable sized bundles. **Logs and Stumps are not collected.**

CAN I FENCE IN MY FRONT YARD?? No.

FRONT YARD FENCES: For clarification or questions call public works, John Haywood, 449-4749, Monday – Friday, 6:30 am – 3:00 pm or email john.haywood@shivelyky.gov.

SECTION 1: The construction of any fence to provide confinement or prevent intrusion beyond the frontface of any residence of the City of Shively is hereby prohibited, EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN Section 2 of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2: Upon the approval of the zoning committee of the Shively City Council, ornamental fencing not exceeding a maximum height of 24 inches may be erected provided it consists of shrubbery, hedges or a single strand chain or a single cable with post supports not exceeding 2 inch diameter for pipe or 4 x 4 inches for wood. The terms used in this ordinance shall be interpreted consistently with regulations now or hereafter in effect.

SECTION 3: The removal and replacement, by personal choice, of the entirety of any existing fencing in the front yard of real estate used for residential purposes is hereby prohibited. However, any portion of such fencing removed by accident or caused to be removed by construction purposes may be restored to its original form.

DO I NEED TO CONTACT THE CITY BEFORE I WIDEN MY DRIVEWAY?? YES.

If you plan to construct, widen or repair a driveway on a city street you are required to have a compliance letter, issued by John Haywood, 449-4749 or a designee of the works department. If you have any questions regarding this, please contact the public works director well before you plan to start your project. The purpose is to protect the city’s road right-of-way.

Code Enforcement

§ 72.44 OPERATION OF VEHICLES ON UNPAVED AREAS PROHIBITED. NO PARKING ON GRASS

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to operate an automobile, truck, motorcycle or other vehicle as defined by Kentucky Revised Statutes or ordinances of the city on or over unpaved areas of residential lots in the city. It shall be the responsibility of the property owner to repair ruts, displacement of soil or other damage caused or apparently caused by vehicular traffic. Failure to make such repair promptly shall be unlawful. Violations of this section shall be subject to the imposition of civil penalties as provided for in § 72.99.

(Ord. 3-2013, passed 4-15-13) Penalty, see § 72.99 **It is important to know ruts can not be filled with gravel. Repair the rut back to original condition, grass and soil.**
