



City tax bills will be mailed out late August. The bills are payable on or before September 30th and are considered delinquent if they are postmarked after that date. You may pay in person at City Hall, 3920 Dixie Hwy., Mon.—Fri. 8—4:30. We accept credit or debit cards, money orders, personal checks or cash. Payments may be made by mail but must be postmarked by September 30th. If the bills are paid after Monday, September 30th to avoid penalty and interest. These fees must be assessed even if you don't receive the tax bill. If you have an escrow account to pay your taxes, it is your responsibility to forward it to your mortgage company. The City makes every attempt to ensure that tax bills are delivered to the property owners in a timely manner. Each year, however, there are tax bill mailings that are returned as undeliverable or that go to an old mailing address you have on file with the PVA. In order to avoid the potential of being charged late fees, if you have not received your tax bill by September 7th call city hall 449-5000 to receive a copy.



#### 1. Why did I receive a real estate tax bill?

Tax bills are mailed to the last property owner of record. Occasionally recent property sales will not be reflected in the tax roll. Please contact city hall if you believe the tax bill you received is meant for someone else.

#### 2. How is real estate property tax determined?

- Property tax assessment and tax rate are the two factors that determine your tax bill.
- Kentucky State law (KRS 160.460) requires all real property be assessed "at one hundred percent (100%) of fair cash value, the Kentucky Constitution (Section 172) defines assessed value as "the price [property] would bring at fair voluntary sale." The Jefferson County Property Valuation Administrator's office (PVA) makes its determination of assessed value by evaluating recent sale prices of similar property, improvements made to property, its location and sales demand.
- The City of Shively's 2024 property tax rate is \$0.354 per \$100 of assessed value (ie, \$100,000 assessed value = \$354.00 tax bill)

#### 3. What if my property is not worth the PVA's assessed value?

Property owners that believe their property's assessed value is incorrect can appeal their tax assessment with the Jefferson County Property Valuation Administrator (PVA) during the annual Open Inspection Period (OIP). Contact the PVA for more information on the appeals process. You can reach their office at (502) 574-6380.

#### 4. Are there any tax exemptions available for property owners?

- Yes. Two exemptions are available for qualifying property owner(s).
- The Homestead Exemption is available to property owners that are 65 years old, or older.
- The Disability Exemption is available to property owners that have been classified as totally disabled by any public or private retirement system.
- Application for exemptions is available at the Jefferson County Property Valuation Administrator office. Contact the PVA for more information on the appeals process. You can reach their office at (502) 574-6380.

#### 5. I pay my taxes to my mortgage company's escrow account; will my mortgage company pay this tax?

Contact your mortgage company to determine whether this tax is to be paid from your mortgage escrow account.

#### 6. When are real estate property taxes due?

September 30th annually. Tax bills are considered delinquent as of October 1st at which time a one time 10% penalty is assessed and interest begins to accrue at a rate of 6% per annum on the unpaid balance.

#### 7. How do I pay a Shively property tax bill?

- By mail checks or money orders can be mailed to Shively Tax Collector, 3920 Dixie Hwy., 40216. Please make sure it is postmarked by September 30th to avoid a late fee.
- In Person checks, money orders, or cash at city hall, 3920 Dixie Hwy., M F, 8am 4:30pm
- By Phone credit/debit cards are accepted by phone (502) 449-5000

#### 8. What happens if I cannot pay my real estate property tax?

Real estate property taxes that remain unpaid as of April 15th following the tax year will be assessed a lien + filing & release recording fees and have a city tax lien filed against the property with the Jefferson County Clerk's Office. Tax liens will be released when tax, penalty, interest, lien & recording fee has been paid in full.

#### 9. My tax bill was mailed to the wrong address, how can I correct the mailing address?

The Jefferson County Property Valuation Administrator (PVA) maintains Tax bill mailing address for Shively and Jefferson County Sheriff. Contact the PVA to change your tax bill mailing address (502) 574-6380.

### **PUBLIC WORKS**

**LARGE ITEM COLLECTION (BULKY ITEMS)** Items not accepted: leaves, grass clippings, tree debris (use weekly yard waste or take large loads to 636 Meriwether Ave.), building materials (lumber, drywall, etc. – take large loads to 636 Meriwether Ave., fees apply), no paint, tires, or other household hazardous (take to Haz Bin, 7501 Grade Lane), no small loose items, no items from other properties.

- ONCE PER MONTH COLLECTION.
- LIMIT OF THREE ITEMS PER PICKUP.
- ITEMS SHALL NOT BE SET OUT NO EARLIER THAN THE NIGHT BEFORE COLLECTION DAYS.
- DESKS, CHAIRS, COUCHES, LOVESEATS, APPLIANCES, ETC., ARE CONSIDERED "LARGE ITEMS."
- BAGS OR BOXES OF SMALL ITEMS MAY BE SET OUT AND WILL BE CONSIDERED ONE OF THE LARGE ITEMS.

Leaves will be turning soon.... It is very important to make sure you are doing your part in keeping all yard debris from impeding water flow. Ditch lines are the property owner's responsibility to clean out and keep clear. We get calls frequently from homeowners wanting us to clean out a neighbor's ditch because it is backing up in their yard. Please be a good neighbor and watch for problem areas, you may be able to help. All ditches, drains and culverts must be free from blockage.
