Greetings from Mayor Maria Johnson

Greetings to all of you and welcome as we gather at the start of a new year. As we embark on 2025, I want to reflect on the incredible opportunities for the City of Shively.

There's a saying that resonates deeply with me: "365 days, 365 new chances." Each day of the year presents us with a fresh start—an opportunity to build on our successes, learn from our challenges, and strive toward an even brighter future. Together, as a community, we have 365 chances to make a difference, improve the lives of our residents, and move Shively forward.

The new year is not just a marker of time, but a renewed commitment to our shared goals. It is a chance to recommit ourselves to the values that unite us and the vision that guides us.

As we step into this year, I am proud to share with you the progress we have made, the challenges we face, and the plans we must undertake to ensure Shively continues to thrive.

On Sunday, January 4th, our city faced a significant snowstorm that brought 12 inches of snow to Shively. This storm tested our readiness and resilience, and I am incredibly proud to say that our city rose to the occasion. Each of our departments—the Fire Department, Police Department, City Hall staff, and Public Works Department went above and beyond the call of duty to ensure our city was prepared and our residents were safe. From clearing roads and ensuring emergency response services remained uninterrupted to providing critical updates and support to the community, their tireless efforts exemplified the true meaning of service. I want to thank every team member for their dedication and hard work during this challenging time.

Congratulations to all the winners of the 2024 Shively General Election! One new council member was elected in November, Saundra Gibson. Five incumbents, Tiffany Burton-McBroom, Kelly Gibson, Shanell Thompson, Wendell Vincent, and Danielle Wakaba were re-elected. I want to thank all the residents who attended the three Planning and Zoning neighborhood meetings. Your presence and active participation are a testament to your commitment to our community's growth and well-being. You have played an integral role in shaping Shively's future by voicing your concerns and sharing your perspectives. These discussions are vital in ensuring that our plans reflect the needs and aspirations of our residents. Your engagement inspires us to work even harder to make Shively a community we are all proud to call home. Thank you for your dedication and involvement.

Reflecting on the past year, I am excited to share a few key achievements from 2024 that highlight our progress and dedication to improving Shively. These accomplishments represent the hard

work of our city departments, the commitment of our community, and our shared vision for a brighter future.

When I took office in 2023, I inherited the challenge of several past-due audits for 2021, 2022, and 2023. These delays were a significant hurdle, but I am proud to share that, through determination and teamwork, we have completed those audits. This accomplishment reflects our commitment to transparency and accountability in city operations. While this was no small task, it was a necessary step toward restoring trust and ensuring Shively's financial stability. We are now actively working with the auditor to complete the 2024 audit, and once finalized, we will officially be back on track. Addressing this challenge has strengthened our foundation, and I am confident it sets the stage for a brighter and more efficient future.

In our diligent pursuit of maintaining community standards, we successfully addressed 1583 code enforcement cases, which not only improved our local environment but also resulted in the collection of \$103,000 in fines and penalties. In 2024 we had 19 new businesses open.

In 2024, Shively patrol officers demonstrated exceptional dedication and effectiveness in serving and protecting the community. Their efforts led to the recovery of 57 stolen vehicles and resulted in 34 arrests. Additionally, officers collaborated with community partners to address longstanding concerns, including the shutdown of Louisville Manor, a recognized nuisance in the area. This action earned gratitude from citizens and local business owners alike.

Shively Fire in 2024 completed a total of 373 Business Inspections, installed 26 home smoke detectors, conducted 20 inspections with Louisville Metro Code Inspectors for renovations-new construction-or commercial properties, and investigated 7 Code violation issues. 27 Company Inspections were done with the Fire crews to "pre-plan for large incidents" and get crews familiar with facilities in the community. They adopted and implemented requirements for inspecting and licensing food trucks in Jefferson County. Shively Fire & Louisville Metro Public Health & Wellness has partnered to increase naloxone access for those in need by managing an access box location 3930 Park Road. They participated in four county-wide inspection events and conducted 15 onsite inspections at the Shively Firehouse. The Fire Department collected for the 71st Annual WHAS Crusade for Children raising \$9,400. Also in 2024, Shively Fire Department hosted its 4th Annual Fire Safety Fair & Chili Cook off for the Fire Prevention month. This event was a huge success as it continues to grow each year in attendance, and has multiple agencies involved in support. The planning has already begun, and the event will be held on October 10, 2025,

In 2024, the Shively Works Department collected 5,318 tons of trash. Recycling efforts continue to grow, with 578.5 tons collected this year. Additionally, the department picked

up 497.5 tons of yard waste and abated over 147 properties. They remain committed to making drainage improvements and addressing resident concerns. Notable projects include:

- **Neblett Avenue:** They Installed 52 feet of drainage pipe and regraded 164 feet of drainage ditch.
- **Donna Road:** Reset a catch basin and regraded the area for improved stormwater collection.
- **Citywide Improvements:** Cleaned and regraded over 2,000 feet of drainage ditches, installed more than 300 feet of drainage pipe, and repaired or replaced multiple catch basins throughout Shively.

These efforts reflect the department's dedication to maintaining a cleaner, safer, and more resilient community.

As I close this address and look ahead to 2025, I want to thank those who have contributed so much to making Shively a remarkable community. To our City Attorney, Finn Cato, your dedication and commitment to serving Shively are truly invaluable. To our city employees, your hard work and perseverance ensure the success of our daily operations, and I am deeply grateful for your efforts. I also want to acknowledge our department heads for their exceptional leadership and for always stepping up to meet the challenges we face. To the City Council, I appreciate your partnership. And finally, to the residents of Shively, thank you for your trust, your input, and your unwavering support. You are the heart of this city, and your voices guide us forward.

As we step into 2025, we are still focusing on key priorities: strengthening our infrastructure, attracting new businesses, and maximizing efficiency in city operations. Together, we can achieve these goals and continue shaping Shively into a city where every resident feels empowered, every resource is used wisely, and every improvement is a step toward a brighter future. Let's move forward with purpose and pride, building on our successes and striving for even greater achievements in the year ahead.

SHIVELY FIRE



The Fire Department continues to stay busy as they handle various runs related to rescues, structure fires and other basic life support issues. In 2024, Fire made a total of 2443 runs, down approximately 100 runs from the previous year.

The following is a breakdown of the runs made:

- 4% Medical Runs (1792)
- 10% Structure Fires/Fire Response (237)
- 11% Automobile Accidents/Fires (314)
- 4% Hazardous/Mitigation (No Fire) (83)
- 1% Uncategorized Service/Good Intent (17)



Candle Safety

Here is some safety information on candles. Candle use is a growing concern as a fire cause and currently is the fifth leading. cause of residential fires.

Facts

December is the peak month for home candle fires.

More than one-third of home candle fires started in the bedroom.

Three of every five candle fires start when things that can burn are too close to the candle.

Safety Tips

Blow out all candles when you leave the room or go to bed. Avoid their use in areas of the house where people may fall asleep. Keep candles at least one foot away from anything that can burn.

Use candle holders that are sturdy and won't tip over easily.

Put candle holders on a sturdy, uncluttered surface.

Light candles carefully. Keep your hair and any loose clothing away from the flame.

Don't burn a candle all the way down — put it out before it gets too close to the holder or container.

Never use a candle if oxygen is used in the home.

Have flashlights and battery-powered lighting ready to use during a power outage. Never use candles.

It is important to keep leaves & trash out of the stormwater system to prevent flooding. Residents can help by keeping debris out of the ditches associated with your property. Yard waste pick-up will resume the first Tuesday in March, March 4, 2025 and continue picking up yard waste every Tuesday through December.

The City of Shively works department works hard to keep the streets clean and our city presentable. Things left at the side of the road are unsightly. To keep the city more presentable we can all work together to follow the trash schedule and only put our large items the night before a large item pick up day. We have all seen trash toters at the side of the road after trash day. Trash toters need to be removed from the side of the road in a timely manner.

Just a few simple things can help our neighbors and our community.

DO I NEED TO CONTACT THE CITY BEFORE I WIDEN/EXPAND/REPLACE MY DRIVEWAY OR

If you plan to construct, widen or repair a driveway on a city street you are required to have a compliance letter, issued by the director Steve Lingerfelt or a designee of the works department.

Apply online at www.shivelyky.gov, if you have any questions regarding this, please contact the public works director before you plan to start your project. The purpose is to protect the city's road right-of-way.

Please set out Yard Waste like this...




Not like this...



Yard waste and leaves should be placed loosely in a 32 Gallon barrel with handles or in special paper thirty (30) gallon capacity leaf bags. These bags can be purchased at local grocery or hardware stores. Yard waste is defined as: grass clippings, weeds, hedge clippings, as well as twigs and brush. Twigs and brush should not be longer than two (4) feet in length and one-half (1/2) inch in diameter. Bags and barrels shall not weigh more than 40 lbs. when full.

We will also pick up branches. Branches can be no wider than 3" in diameter and no longer than 4' and must be tied for pickup in manageable sized bundles. Logs and Stumps are not

Q. Do I have to remove staples, clasps, envelopes etc. before you Pulverize my documents?"

A. No, you do not have to groom your documents. All office paper products – staples, clasps, accordion folders – can be Pulverized.

Q. Can I be sure my documents are totally destroyed?

A. Yes. Our shredding is guaranteed, 100% destroyed, on-site at the time of pickup.

Q. Is this service guaranteed?

A. Yes, A Plus Shredding is guaranteed that all documentation is 100% destroyed and we are fully insured.

Q. Can I watch my documentation be destroyed?

A. No. You will carry your documents into city hall, you will feed your paper documents through a slot in the top of locked security bin. Bring only sensitive documents to be shredded. We do not accept catalogs, paperback books, magazines, binders, etc.


Make sure no items are mixed in with your documents. We have seen remote controls, scissors, toys, and socks mixed in, also no wet documents. These contaminants can break the shredding truck's equipment.
