The Program of All Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) model is centered on the belief that the well-being of seniors with chronic care needs and their families are better served in the community.

Senior CommUnity Care provides health care and supportive services enabling older adults to sustain independence and continue living in their home whenever possible. We are a service of Volunteers of America, a non-profit, organization.

Enrollment

Our Enrollment Specialist will meet with you and a family member or caregiver to explain the program. They will do an assessment of your eligibility and schedule a visit to our Center and a meeting with your doctor, nurses and other key staff. You will receive a medical evaluation and a custom care plan.

We complete the enrollment paperwork for you to become a participant. Enrollment is voluntary. You may disenroll at any time by notifying the **Senior CommUnity Care of Kentucky** social worker.

Eligibility

Seniors are eligible for this program if they:

- Are 55 or older
- · Live in the service area
- Meet nursing home level of care certified by the state.
- Can live safely at home with our services


The PACE Interdisciplinary team includes:

2025 PROPERTY TAX BILLS INFORMATION - Due date 9/30

The 2025 tax bills will be mailed in mid - August, call city hall if you do not receive it by August 31, or email taxoffice@shivelyky.gov, to request a copy. The tax bills are mailed only to the property owner at the address provided by the Jefferson County Property Valuation Administrator. If your tax payment is made by your mortgage company or made by someone other than you, it is your responsibility to provide a copy of your tax bill to whomever pays your taxes.

CODE ENFORCEMENT REMINDERS: CODE@SHIVELYKY.GOV

- Vehicles must be parked on hard, durable surfaces only (concrete, asphalt, or paved areas)
- Parking on dirt, grass, or unpaved surfaces is not permitted
- Semi-trucks are not allowed to park in residential areas
- Parking Pads in front of homes are private property, not intended for public use
- New or expansion of driveway/parking pad requires approval of Shively Public Works
- All vehicles on the property must be properly licensed and in working condition
- Inoperable or unlicensed vehicles should be stored inside a garage or removed from the property
- Basketball hoops and goals cannot be placed in or on public streets

These guidelines help ensure our neighborhood remains a safe, attractive place for all residents. If you have any questions about these requirements or need clarification on any point, please don't hesitate to contact our Code Enforcement Office.

PET OWNERS Any animal must be on a leash and not be permitted to run at large when not in an enclosed backyard. Keep in mind, police officers are not equipped to corral stray animals in their vehicles nor do they have the facilities to confine animals. You should contact Louisville Metro Animal Services. You must also clean up after your pet—PLEASE, do not toss the poo bag on city property or on your neighbors lawn. To report a stray animal, or if you suspect cruelty to an animal and as long as it is not a wild animal, please call Metro Animal Services at 473-PETS (7387). For more information about their services, go to their website at LouisvillyKY.gov and click on "Resident" tab and then on "Animals". Please be a responsible pet owner and a better neighbor—and dispose of your pet's waste properly and keep your pets leashed.

SAFETY TIPS

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.
- CHARCOAL GRILLS
- There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use.

- Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid.

 Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.



Trash, Recycling, and Large Item Pickup Guidelines







To help keep our city clean and safe, please follow these guidelines for trash, recycling, and large item collection:

- Trash and Recycling Toters:
- Set your toters out the night before or by 6:30 a.m. on collection day. Toters should be removed from the curbside the same day after pickup.
- Large Item Pickup:
- Large items should be set out the night before your scheduled pickup day:
- If your regular trash day is Wednesday, your large item pickup is on the second Friday of each month.
- If your regular trash day is Thursday, your large item pickup is on the third Friday of each month.
- Each household is allowed up to three large items per pickup, and all loose items must be contained (bagged, boxed, or bundled).
- Large items should not be placed at the curb on any day other than your designated pickup day.
